School Happenings: Congratulations to our winter sports teams and all of your accomplishments. Special congratulations to the boy's basketball team on their regular season and FKC tournament championships. Congratulations also to KC DeFillips and Zachary Zeleski on qualifying for the state wrestling tournament. Special congratulations to Zachary Zeleski on his 5<sup>u</sup> place finish at state.

Kindergarten Enrollment Requirements: Students must be 5 years of age by July 31 to be allowed to attend Kindergarten. If your child turns 5 between August 1st and October 15th, you may request your child be assessed on their readiness for Kindergarten work. There is paperwork that must be completed prior to this assessment. You will need to contact the school to receive and complete the Written Request for Consideration of Early Kindergarten Entrance. The testing will take place this summer on a date to be determined.

Pre-K Registration: We have scheduled two days for Pre-School Registration for the 2013-2014 School Year. They are Friday, April 19th and Friday, May 3rd from 8:30 - 11:00 AM. We thank you for making every effort to make one of these registration days. If you are unable to make one of these days, please contact the school to make arrangements to register at another time. Students that are 4 years of age by July 31st are eligible to attend Pre-School. When you register you will need to bring your child's birth certificate and immunization records.

NeSA Testing: This testing is our Nebraska State Assessment that every student in grades 3-8 & 11 will take in April. These tests will be in Reading, Mathematics, and Science. These tests are very important as we will be compared with every other school district across the state. Your help in re-enforcing the importance of these assessments to your children at home along with ensuring they are well rested and prepared when their test day arrives is greatly appreciated.

APRIL'S CHARACTER TRAITS:

Balance and Caring/Earth Day

- IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA AT LINCOLN!!! UNL will no longer accept ACT or SAT scores sent from high schools starting with students entering in the summer or fall of 2011. These test scores MUST be sent to UNL DIRECTLY from the testing agency! Any student interested in attending UNL should make sure they choose UNL's code when registering for these tests. The scores will be sent to UNL for free. If any parent or student has any questions about this policy, please ask Mrs. Luther.
- SENIORS: Have you checked out Overton's website? Click on the "College Information" link. JUNIORS—it's never too early to look at this yourself! Another site available is SchoolSoup.com. It is supposed to be the largest scholarship database in the world. We have added this link to our website, as well.
- SENIORS: If you think you might do your FAFSA online, you need to register for a PIN.

  Dependent students must have their parents register. This may be done at

  www.pin.ed.gov. FAFSA is the form that allows you to receive college grants and loans
  from the government. You will not fill out the form until after the first of the year,
  but you can apply for your PIN anytime.
- POTENTIAL COLLEGE ATHLETES: register with the NCAA clearinghouse! Come see me if you have any questions. ACT scores must be sent to the clearinghouse via ACT, not our school. PLEASE NOTE!!! The NCAA is changing eligibility rules beginning with this year's senior and freshmen classes. Division II schools have increased the number of core classes from 14 to 16, a rule that starts with this year's senior class. Division I has increased its minimum core class GPA from 2.0 to 2.3. They will also require that 10 of the 16 core course requirements be finished before the beginning of the student's 7<sup>th</sup> semester, or at the beginning of their senior year. This will impact this year's freshmen students.
- The NAIA has started a registration process for potential athletes, much like the NCAA. If you have a student interested in playing for one of these colleges, check out their website at www.playnaia.org.
- The next ACT TESTING DATE is April 13<sup>th</sup>. Registration for that test has passed. The next ACT will be on June 8<sup>th</sup>. Registration for that test is due by May 3<sup>rd</sup>. ACT tests will be given in Overton in April and June. Students who qualify for free or reduced lunch prices may be able to receive a fee waiver from ACT. Remember you now MUST upload a picture to your application!!!! See Mrs. Luther for more information.
- ACT reports that 70% of all test-takers now register online. They are encouraging as many students as possible to sign up in this manner. Information is in Mrs. Luther's office; or you may go to act.org for details or to set up a free account.
- The UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA AT LINCOLN'S COLLEGE OF ARCHITECTURE will again sponsor summer workshop for high school students in 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades. The workshop will be on the UNL campus from June 9<sup>th</sup> to June 15<sup>th</sup>. Students interested in Architecture, Interior Design, or Landscape Architecture are encouraged to apply before April 5<sup>th</sup>. The fee is \$585 and includes meals, lodging, and supplies. See Mrs. Luther for an application!!!

- BRYAN COLLEGE OF HEALTH SCIENCES in Lincoln will be hosting a HEALTH CAREER CAMP this summer for high school students to learn more about the medical field. The camp will be held either July 8-12 or July 22-26. See Mrs. Luther if you are interested.
- The UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA AT LINCOLN is again hosting BIG RED SUMMER ACADEMIC CAMPS. The camps will be held June 9-14 on the UNL campus for 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders (9<sup>th</sup> graders can enroll in the Unicameral Youth Legislature Camp) (grade that will be entered in fall 2013). There is a discount to enroll before April 1<sup>st</sup>. The award is valued at \$500 for a senior planning to major in a physical science area. Applications are in Mrs. Luther's office and are due April 1st.
- \* COLLEGEBOUND NEBRASKA is a scholarship program available through the University and State College systems in Nebraska. If a student is eligible for a Pell Grant through the FAFSA process, they may be able to receive a full tuition grant. Students and parents must complete the FAFSA process by April 1st to be eligible. See Mrs. Luther with any questions!!
- \* CENTRAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE will again offer \$150 SUMMER SCHOLARSHIPS for current juniors and seniors to take a summer course through CCC.
