News and activity from Mrs. Ryan's Room

Students have been working to meet goals throughout the first semester. During small group sessions, students complete a variety of activities to improve student performance on reading, math and other needed areas.

Sixth graders are reading "Banner in the Sky," discussing the chapters/vocabulary, answering questions and taking multiple chapter tests. Fourth graders have been focusing on spelling, grammar, practice, daily language and math. Preschool has been identifying/writing letters and numbers. Kindergarten, First, Second, and Third grades have been progressing through the Reading Triumphs program. AR tests are taken frequently to meet monthly reading goals. Students are reminded to take advantage of access period, redo assignments and study for semester tests. Next semester we welcome Paige Stute, as she begins student teaching with us.

It has been exciting to see the students meeting goals, improving test scores and skills. It is wonderful to see kid's face light up when they make reading goals and raise reading levels due to practice and hard work. We look forward to what second semester has to bring.

This semester in my classroom we have had a competition for hundred percent in accelerated math. The first quarter my sophomores in Algebra 2 won with an 82% average and my eighth graders came in second with a 75% average. It was great to see my students succeed at this, and they are on the same track for second quarter. We have one week left for accelerated math before semester and right now my sophomores are at 86% average and my freshmen are at a 77% average. It is a close race and we will see who wins at semester. I am really excited for second semester for a great project that we do in Geometry with making kites. The students get so creative and it is fun to see them learn in a creative way. Hopefully this next semester the students do as great as they have done so far.

New Social Studies Curriculum

This past fall began the implementation of a new Social Studies Curriculum with the purchase of new textbooks for all the K-12th grade classes. This process began with the alignment of the Overton Public School Social Studies Curriculum with the new Nebraska State Social Studies Standards adopted in December 2012.

The new Social Studies textbooks adopted for the 5th to 12th grade classes were purchased to use the availability of the advancing technology being used at Overton Public Schools. All 9th to 12th grade textbooks were purchased in a digital format that were directly loaded onto each of the 9th to 12th grade students' ipads. As the inclusion of using ipads expands into the middle schools grades, this technology will also be available.

Numerous technology pieces are available for use in the classroom including many online resources such as an online interactive version of the textbook and access to the History Channel's many full length and video clips that enhance the lessons being taught. In the future students will be able to access and complete some assignments online as the staff and students become more familiar with using this technology.

- IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA AT OMAHA!!! UNO will no longer accept ACT or SAT scores sent from high schools starting with students entering in the summer or fall of 2015. These test scores MUST be sent to UNO DIRECTLY from the testing agency! Any student interested in attending UNO should make sure they choose UNO's code when registering for these tests. The scores will be sent to UNO for free. UNL already follows this policy for ACT scores. If any parent or student has any questions about this policy, please ask Mrs. Luther.
- SENIORS: Have you checked out Overton's website? Click on the "College Information" link.

 JUNIORS—it's never too early to look at this yourself! Another site available is

 SchoolSoup.com. It is supposed to be the largest scholarship database in the world. We have added this link to our website, as well.
- SENIORS: If you think you might do your FAFSA online, you need to register for a PIN.

 Dependent students must have their parents register. This may be done at www.pin.ed.gov. FAFSA is the form that allows you to receive college grants and loans from the government. You will not fill out the form until after the first of the year, but you can apply for your PIN anytime.
- POTENTIAL COLLEGE ATHLETES: register with the NCAA clearinghouse! Come see me if you have any questions. ACT scores must be sent to the clearinghouse via ACT, not our school. PLEASE NOTE!!! The NCAA is changing eligibility rules beginning with this year's senior and freshmen classes. Division II schools have increased the number of core classes from 14 to 16. Division I has increased its minimum core class GPA from 2.0 to 2.3. They will also require that 10 of the 16 core course requirements be finished before the beginning of the student's 7th semester, or at the beginning of their senior year.
- The NAIA has started a registration process for potential athletes, much like the NCAA. If you have a student interested in playing for one of these colleges, check out their website at www.playnaia.org.
- The next ACT TESTING DATE is February 8th. Registration for that test is due January 10th, with late registration extending to January 24th. THIS ACT TEST WILL NOT BE GIVEN IN OVERTON!!!
