The first newsletter of the year is a great signal that the first day of school is less than a month away. <u>Wednesday, August 13th</u> will be here before we know it. There has been a lot of work going on at school this summer to get ready for the new school year. I hope that everyone has had a wonderful summer vacation and is ready for another great school year.

New Student Registration: We have scheduled Monday, August 4th from 9 A.M to 2 P.M. for new student registration. If you are new to the district please try to attend this session as the first day of school is too hectic for this activity. Please feel free to come in before this date to register also. If you have any questions please call myself or Ms. Stevens at the school. If you would like to schedule a time to take a tour of the school facility, talk about our curriculum, or meet a staff member, please stop by or call me (Mr. Fleischman) at (308) 987-2424 ext.206.

Dress Code: Please help us ensure students are dressed appropriately for school. Check to see that clothes meet the dress standards addressed in the general school policies of the student handbook. These policies haven't changed from previous years. Shorts must be hemmed and long enough to cover the legs where the fingers touch when arms are hanging at the side, tanktops straps must be at least "two adult fingers" wide, the midriff area must always be covered, shorts and jeans are not to be sagging, etc. Thank you for your help with this issue.

PowerSchool ID and Passwords: For all new and returning students, a letter with the ID and password will be sent out in the mail during the first couple of weeks of school. Once logged into PowerSchool you will have access to student schedules, assignments, grades, and lunch balances. If you have any problems logging in or have questions please contact me. If you created your parent account last year, this should still work for your login this year. If you haven't created your parent login, I encourage you to do so since all student information can be accessed through Powerschool including report cards. A reminder that these will not be mailed out for grades 5-12 anymore.

iPad Initiative: I am very excited to announce the 3rd phase of our 1:1 iPad initiative at Overton Public School. This summer we purchased iPads to be 1:1 in grades 7-12 for this school year. We also purchased another cart so each K-4 classroom has its own iPad cart. This initiative brings a great deal of responsibility to the school, students, and parents. Thank you for your cooperation to make this move to 21st Century Skills very successful and meaningful to the education of our students. A reminder to all students in grades 7-12 to attend your distribution meeting on Wednesday, July 23rd, Thursday, July 24th, or Monday, July 28th.

Meal Prices: Meal prices have increased \$.05 from last school year. Breakfast will cost \$1.30 for grades K-12 and \$1.55 for adults. Lunch prices will be as follows: K-4 \$2.20; 5-12 \$2.75; Adults \$3.50. I encourage all families to fill out a free/reduced application. Reduced prices are \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch. Please make all efforts possible to keep lunch balances up to date

throughout the school year. It is our goal to have everyone at a zero or positive balance to begin the school year. Please help ensure that your lunch balances are kept up-to-date throughout the year. A reminder that any balance over \$25 will receive a sack lunch and if the balance is not taken care of within two weeks, your child will not be allowed to eat school meals. Thank you for your cooperation in the matter.

School Opening Information: Overton Public School will begin on Wednesday, August 13^{th} , starting at 8:10 AM. School will be in session until 2:30 PM. Breakfast and lunch will be served on the first day. The bus drivers will notify parents/guardians as to when bus students will be picked up. Normal school hours are from 8:00 to 3:28 Monday through Thursday. Every Friday, school will be dismissed at 2:30 with buses running accordingly. Breakfast will be served each day from 7:45 – 8:05 AM. Students can enter through the main parking lot doors for breakfast. If students are not eating breakfast, they are not to be in the building until the bell rings at 8:00. Students are to leave the building immediately after school, unless they are with a teacher.

All students driving to school must park in the northeast parking lot and enter the school through the east doors. Please be sure to park you cars properly so that everyone has room to park and there aren't any accidents in the lot. Parents/guardians delivery and pick-up should be in front of the school. <u>Please do not pick up or drop students off in the parking lot.</u>

High school students walking to school are to enter through the main lobby doors in front of the school. 7th and 8th grade students walking to school are to enter through the doors by the flagpole. 5th and 6th grade students walking to school are to enter through the southeast doors and K-4 students should enter through the northeast doors. If you are eating breakfast, you need to enter through the parking lot doors

Preschool will begin on Monday, August 25th. Hours for preschool will be from 8:10-2:00 PM, Monday through Thursday. 4-year Preschool, please use the doors by the Pre-School room.

Physicals: All students in the 7th and 8th grade must have a school physical. This is a requirement for all students to help ensure their safety. Any student participating on any of the school's athletic teams must also have a physical before they are allowed to participate. All students entering Kindergarten must have a Kindergarten physical before they will be allowed to attend school. Any student transferring from out of state must have a physical before they can attend school.

Insurance: Parents and guardians are reminded that Overton Public School does not provide any type of health or accident insurance for injuries incurred by your child at school. We encourage all families to have accident coverage on their children, prior to participation in any sport or school sponsored activity. Accident insurance is offered by Overton Public School to all families through an outside agency. The insurance forms will be handed out to the students the first day of school to be taken home for parents/guardians to review.

I look forward to the new school year beginning and having a great year just like last year. Have a great rest of the summer and I will see everyone in a few weeks.

Superintendent's Office

I am always amazed at how quickly the summer months seem to fly by. It seems like just yesterday the students were dismissed for the summer break and now we are preparing for another school year. It is always exciting to begin a new school year, to renew old acquaintances and have the opportunity to meet new parents and students. I am very proud of the staff that we have assembled to serve the educational needs of the students, and I believe there is no better group than the one right here in Overton. It is also very rewarding to work with a board of education whose primary goal is to provide our students with the best education possible.

I would like to invite any parent or patron who is interested in serving on any of our committees to contact either Mr. Fleischman or myself. If you are not sure of what committees are available give me a call. Your input and participation is very important to us. I also continue to encourage parents and patrons to use the school's web site as a source of information. Our students (and Mr. Brumm) do a very nice job of maintaining and updating the web site.

We continue to stress the importance of academic success for all our students. The Continuing Improvement Process (CIP) goals remain mathematics and reading. The NeSA testing will continue in the writing, reading, mathematics, and science areas. The John Baylor ACT Test Prep program will continue to be offered this year. This program helps prepare our students for the ACT test. This will be our third year of using the MAP testing program. This assessment program has allowed our staff more information on the progress of each of our students.

The school board has approved the continued implementation of the 1:1 iPad initiative. Each of our high school students has their own iPad. We are now implementing the 1:1 iPad with our seventh and grade students. The student's textbooks are all in digital format and will have access to the internet through our updated wireless network. I would like to thank the school board for their forward thinking and support of our students and staff in this imitative. Without the school board's support this program would not be available. Our elementary students have access to a mini iPad cart which will help bring the technology to all of our students.

I would like to thank Brenda Buchholz for supervising the summer food program. We will continue to offer a breakfast program for the upcoming school year. It was nice to see so many of our students utilizing the program throughout this past school year. We will continue to provide fruit and vegetables to our elementary students again this school year. USDA has decided not to award the fruit and vegetable grant for this school year, however, the school board has approved the continuation of the program without the grant. Thank you to the school board for supporting this excellent program. This year the food program will continue to concentrate on serving healthier meals to our students which will include fewer calories per meal.

I would like to welcome four new staff members for the 2014-2015school year. Miss. Gillian Hogeland will teach our preschool students, Ms. Michelle Stevens will be our new K-12 Counselor, Mr. Caleb Lempka will be our new K-12 Physical Education/Health teacher. These are a great group of teachers. Please make them feel welcome! Mr. Little will be our new Athletic Director and head boys basketball coach. Mr. Ehlers will be the boys basketball assistant coach and Mr. Lempka will be our new assistant football coach and Jr. High boys coach. Mr. Simpson will be our head track coach.

I would also like to thank the staff members who took time out of their busy summer schedules to work at our summer school program. Thirty-two students participated in the summer school program in the months of June and July.

Each summer allows much needed projects to be completed. New concrete sidewalks and pad were poured at the Family Center and football and track complex. New carpet was installed in classrooms 306, 201, and 203. We have expanded our preschool to include three year old students and have increased the time each day from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday. The preschool has a new bathroom and new chain linked fencing has been installed around the playground arca. We have installed new on-demand hot water machines for the kitchen and Jr. High girls locker room areas. These machines are more efficient and will serve our school well. The school added a new 2015 school bus to the fleet. We continue to maintain a very effective wireless network and filtering system.

The school has once again been a very busy place over the summer as we prepare for the 2014-2015 school year. I would like to thank the custodial staff for another job well done in preparing the facility for the new school year. Please feel free to come to the school and see the projects and upgrades that were completed this summer. The entire staff is looking forward to providing the best educational environment for the students of our school.

Bus Transportation

Cindy Davenport, Shirley Ryan, and Shannon Lauby will be the bus drivers for the 2014-2015 school year. We are very fortunate to have such highly qualified and safe drivers transporting our students/staff. The bus routes and approximate student pick-up and drop-off times for the 2014-2015 school year will be determined by August 6, 2014. When developing these routes we try to keep all the students bus riding times as even as possible. We will plan to pick up the same students who rode last year, plus any new students, and the kindergarten students unless we are notified otherwise. We are also asking all families who are new to our district, and live outside of Overton, to contact the school by Thursday, July 31, and provide us with the physical and mailing address, student and parent names, home phone and cell numbers, and grades of all children riding the bus. Once the routes are established the drivers will notify each parent of the approximate pick-up and drop-off times.

Our bus routes are designed with safety as the utmost priority. As much as possible, the pick-ups and drop-offs will be made so that students will not have to cross the road to board the bus.

If there are any students who rode the bus last year, but do not intend to do so this year, please notify Mr. Aten as soon as possible.

We are asking that rather than calling the school, parents are asked to call their respective bus drivers if your child/children will not be riding the route. Any change of destination will require a note or phone call from the parents to either the bus driver or the teacher.

The following are the basic student expectations when riding the Overton Public School buses on either routes or activities, and it will be appreciated if all students and parents will help see that these are met.

- 1. All passengers are under the supervision of the driver. Students may be assigned seats if the driver feels that is in the best interest and safety of all passengers.
- 2. Students must be on time, the bus cannot wait for those who are late.
- 3. Outside of ordinary conversation, classroom conduct is to be observed by students. Any student not meeting district and bus driver expectations will forfeit the privilege of riding the bus. Students not meeting expectations may be assigned detentions through the Principal's office.



Athletic Activities Information

All students who plan on participating in athletic practices or contests need to have the following:

Extra-curricular handbook signature pages must be signed by parent/guardian and returned to Mr. Little.

Seventh grade students must a have a physical performed by the family physician and the paperwork returned to Mr. Litle.

Students in grades nine through twelve are required to provide a \$50.00 deposit.

Students who participate in athletic activities must have a physical and card turned into Mr. Little.

Students will be tested to establish a concussion base line score.

Students who participate in athletic activities must sign up for the extra-curricular random drug testing program at the beginning of the school year or upon enrollment in the district.

Students who participate in athletic activities must meet all academic requirements set forth by the Overton Public Schools and the NSAA.

Food Program News

Overton Public School has wonderful breakfast and lunch programs. We are very pleased with the many students who take advantage of these programs. We also thank the many families who stay current on the meal balance. However, due to the increase of unpaid balances in the food program, which includes breakfast and lunch, we will continue the following procedure in the 2014-2015 school year.

There will be a \$25.00 limit on the amount of an unpaid balance per child.

- Once the \$25.00 limit has been reached the parent/guardian will be contacted. A note will be sent home in the folder of the K-4 students, and a note will be handed to the 5-12 students.
- Once the \$25.00 limit has been reached, the child will be provided with a sack lunch consisting of a sandwich, fruit, and carton of milk. The meal will be reimbursable and will meet the Nebraska Department of Education Nutritional Services guidelines, and will be charged at the current lunch rate. The students will not be allowed to go through the salad bar.
- The sack lunch will be provided to the child for a maximum of two weeks. After the two weeks, the child will receive no school meals until the balance is paid or the school is contacted. If you are having problems paying the balance, please contact the school.
- Once the \$25.00 limit has been reached, the child is no longer eligible for the breakfast program. The child will become eligible for breakfast once the balance is paid or the school is contacted.
- As soon as the balance is paid, or the school is contacted, the child will be eligible to participate in the breakfast and lunch program.

It is also strongly recommended that you contact the school to determine if your family qualifies for the USDA free or reduced meal program. Please contact Mr. Fleischman regarding this program.

In order to help families keep track of the meal balance each child's account, it is recommended powerschool is utilized. Powerschool maintains an up to date balance of each person that participates in the school food program. To access powerschool use the following procedure:

Go to the school web site (www.ovr.esu10.k12.ne.us).

Click on the power school Parent/Student login link and enter your login information

The current balance as well as all transactions for the school year are available on the left side of the screen under the Balance Tab. Your current login will work. Mr. Fleischman will also be sending out reminders of your login and password the first week of school. Your contact person for this procedure is Kristi Shafer. Please contact her with any questions. Hello from the Kitchen-

We would like to welcome everyone back for another fun filled school year! And we would like to wish our new staff members good luck in their first year at OHS!

A quick review of the lunch program is as follows:

Alternate Meal Choice- Program starts the week of August 25th. You will note on the menu at the beginning of each week there is a menu item (pizza, corn dogs, etc). This is the other menu choice that the students have for the week (Monday - Thursday). Students 5-12 and staff must sign up in the kitchen by 9:00 on the day of the meal. Students grades k-4 will let their teacher know at the time of lunch count in the classroom. There is no alternate choice on Fridays. If you have any questions please feel free to come see us in the kitchen.

Ala Carte Snacks – Students and Staff can buy snacks after all the students have gone through the lunch line. All snacks must be ate in the commons or the south gym. Teachers may use the ala carte snacks as an incentive.

Extra Entrée - An extra serving of the main course or alternate choice maybe purchased in the lunch line for \$1.00. The extra alternate choice must be ordered by 9:00.

Coaches - We are more than happy to wash water bottles. Please leave the bottles in the kitchen or by the kitchen door after practice and we will make sure they are back in the training room the next day. This might be something student managers can do. I know in the past a kitchen staff member has gotten the bottles in the morning but we just don't have the time to do it. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

Fruit & Vegetable Program -We would like to let you know that we will not be participating in the Nebraska Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program but the School Board and Administration saw the importance of this program so it will be continued with a few additions. This program is interested in providing fresh fruits and vegetable snacks to all students and staff. Preschool thru 12th grade students will have access to fruit and vegetable snacks anytime after 9 a.m. Monday thru Friday. For grades 5-8 we will prepare and place the items in a special cooler in the kitchen, and it will be up to you when you would like to serve the snack. The Preschool and grades K - 4 will continue as we have in the past. And 9 - 12 can pick up a snack in the cooler in the kitchen or somewhere else if a teacher is interested in being involved.

As a participating school we had been given a packet of information about fruits and vegetables as well as reproducible handouts and activities that you may use in the classroom. Some ideas are Art projects (stamps, collages & sculptures) Math projects (fractions & visual aids) English (descriptive writing), Geography/Social Studies (where certain foods are grown & how they are eaten) and with the addition of the 7th & 8th grades Family & Consumer Science (healthy snack preparation, nutrition & more), If you have a special project or plans that involve fruits or vegetables simply fill out the attached request from ONE WEEK in advance and we can provide the produce for This summer I went to meeting about nutrition education in the classroom and came back with curriculum for K-8. If you would like to borrow the books you are more than welcome.

Concessions- If you are sponsoring a group that will be having concessions or a soup supper type of event and would like me to get your supplies please contact me at least a week in advance. I can provide you with any or all of the food and paper products for your event. Your group will be billed for only the items you use or sell.

Please make sure that the popcorn popper machine and kettle are cleaned out after you use it. The commons and kitchen must also be cleaned. There is a Use of the Kitchen Form to fill out if your event is happening at a time that is not a normal scheduled game or event. If you have any questions please feel free ask.

Thank you for your time and we look forward to a great school year.

Microwave use: When sending something that needs to microwaved for your student's lunch please keep in mind that students only have a limited amount of time to eat and that the staff at lunch have many students to watch out for. And for this reason I am asking that you do not send anything that has to be cooked or take more than 2 minutes to heat. This would include but limited to Kraft Mac & Cheese Cups (or any other brands), Ramen Noodles, purchased cups of soups or pastas and microwavable meals.

Also make sure that your child can open and heat the item at home so that they are capable to do it at school. Make sure that your child as when need to heat the item up. There are napkins and other items at school but those are purchased with the Hot Lunch Program in mind.

There is a new microwave in the Commons Area to be used by the students and staff.



Alternate Choice at Lunch

The Overton School Hot Lunch Program offers an alternate meal choice Monday-Thursday. The student may choose to have the alternate in place of the main entrée for the day. The alternate choice is posted on the menu and is the same for the entire week. Grades 5-12 must sign up

in the kitchen by 9:00 am for the alternate.

If a student is not in class at the time that lunch count is taken, they will be served the main entrée for the day.

Alternate meal is subject to change and notification of the change will be in the announcements and posted in the kitchen.

Notice of NCLB Qualifications

The No Child Left Behind Act gives parents the right to obtain information concerning the professional qualifications of a student's teacher(s). Overton Public Schools will provide, upon request, the following information.

- 1. whether or not the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade level and subject area in which the teacher provided instruction
- 2. whether or no the teacher is teaching under an emergency or provisional teaching certificate
- 3. the baccalaureate degree major of the teacher along with the other degrees held by the teacher

Also, upon request, information on whether or not a student is being provided services by a paraprofessional and, if so, the qualifications of the paraprofessional.

Request for this information should be made to the Superintendent's office (308)987-2424.

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973

Section 504 is a Federal Civil Rights Rehabilitation Act, which prohibits discrimination against persons with a disability in any program receiving federal financial assistance. The Act defines a person with a disability as anyone who:

- has a mental or physical impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities (major life activities include activities such as caring for one's self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning, and working):
- has a record of such impairment; or

is regarded as having such an impairment.

In order to fulfill obligations under Section 504, the Overton Public Schools has the responsibility to avoid discrimination in policies and practices regarding its personnel and students. No discrimination against any person with a disability should knowingly be permitted in any of the program and practices of the school system.

The school district has responsibilities under Section 504 (Part D), which include the obligation to identify, evaluate, and if the student is determined to be eligible under Section 504, to afford access to appropriate educational services.

If the parent or guardian disagrees with the determination made by the professional staff of the school distict, he/she has a right to a hearing with an impartial hearing officer.

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) also specifies rights related to educational records. This Act gives the parent or guardian the right to: (1) inspect and review his/her child's educational records; (2) make copies of these records; (3) receive a list of all individuals having access to those records; (4) ask for an explanation of any item in the records; (5) ask for an amendment to any part of the record on the grounds that it is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the child's rights; and (6) a hearing on the issue if the school refuses to make the amendment.

Keeping Information Current

Our school offices try to **keep all phone numbers and addresses current** in case of emergency situations. If your child would have an accident or be in need of a parent's presence, we cannot contact you if we do not have current information. It is vital that you update the office **and** teachers when information has changed.

GOLDEN AGE LIFE-TIME PASSES

Any <u>district resident</u> who has reached the age of 65 is invited to request a Golden Age Life-Time Pass. This pass must be <u>presented</u> to the ticket taker to entitle the holder to FREE admission to all <u>home</u> Overton High School <u>athletic</u> activities, with the exception of locally-hosted conference and district tournaments, and special fund-raising events. The Golden Age Life-Time Pass is completely free and may be obtained by applying <u>personally</u> for one at Mrs. Ginkens' office.

NOTICE OF NON-DISCRIMINATION

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NOTICE OF ASBESTOS PLAN AVAILABLE

The Overton Public School System's asbestos management plan is located in the office of the Asbestos Program manager, the current Superintendent, and may be reviewed by requesting permission through his or the principal's office. A copy of the basic building will be located in the Superintendent's office.

Beyond the asbestos assumed to be located in concrete, roofing felts, pipe elbows, and carpet glues, etc., which is of minimal public health concern, asbestos was found in the materials in the acoustical ceiling-wall finishes, and vinyl floor tile.

HANDICAPPED CHILD FIND

Public Law 94-142 and Rules 51 and 54 mandate that a free, appropriate public education is available for each handicapped child age 0-21.

Handicapped children are those defined as handicapped physically, visually, speech, orthopedically, mentally, specific learning disabled, behaviorally, multi-handicapped, home or hospital bound and whose handicap requires special services or education.

SEASON PASSES AVAILABLE

Adult admission to athletic contests will be \$4.00 and students \$3.00 to attend individual games. However, you may save money by purchasing an Adult Athletic Pass for \$35.00 and Student Athletic Pass for \$25.00. The pass entitles your admission to all regular HOME season football, volleyball, and basketball games including track meets and wrestling matches at Overton High School. Tickets are available from the Superintendent's office.

SCHOOL DIRECTORY INFORMATION

SCHOOL CLOSING INFORMATION

In the event that the Overton School should be closed due to inclement weather, the announcement will be made on KHAS-TV (Channel 5), KOLN-TV (Channel 11), KHGI-TV (Channel 13), KRVN Radio and KGFW radio. We will also use our One Call Alert System and will send a recorded message directly to the phone number we have on file for your family. If you have more than one number that you want called, you will have to let the school know. Every effort will be made to notify the TV and radio stations as soon as possible. If, for some reason, we need to close school after it has been in session, we will call KRVN, Lexington, for the announcement. There is also a link from the school's web site "Closings", to inform the public on the status of school. Again, we will use the One Call System. No doubt there will be times when we should dismiss and don't, and there will be times when we do dismiss and shouldn't, but we need to use our own best judgment. It is a decision that is not an easy one to make. Remember, though, that you as a parent have the final determination to either send your child to school or keep your child home during inclement weather. If you have doubts whether the Overton School is dismissing, due to bad weather, please listen to one of the stations listed above for the information. We would like to encourage parents to have a "family emergency plan" in place with your child/children so that each family member automatically knows what to do in the event of this type of an emergency. We ask that you do not call the school or the superintendent's home for this information. We will get the information out to the TV and radio stations as soon as possible.



"LOCAL SPANISH STUDENTS SCORE WELL"

Congratulations to three Spanish 1 students from Overton High School who attained national recognition for excellent performance on the 2014 National Spanish Examinations. In order of ranking, they are Monica Meier, Taylor Kizer and Bricen Margritz. All three students received honorable mention and were close to bronze medal status.

"Attaining a medal or honorable mention for any student on the National Spanish Examinations is very prestigious," said Kevin Cessna-Buscemi, National Director of the Exams, "because the exams are the largest of their kind in the United States with over 154,000 students participating in 2014."

The National Spanish Examinations are administered each year in Overton's first and second year Spanish classes, and are sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese.

Back-to-School Food Safety Reminders

A mericans of all ages carry bag lunches to school or work. Ensure a safe lunch -- handle it safely.

Perishable food must be kept cold while commuting via bicycle, car, bus, subway or on foot. After arrival, perishable food should be kept cold.

Clean: Clean Hands, Clean Surfaces

- Wash hands with warm, soapy water before preparing or eating food.
- Wash utensils and countertops with hot, soapy water after preparing each food item.



 Use clean packaging and bags.

Separate: Don't Cross-Contaminate

- Use one cutting board for fresh produce and a different one for meat and poultry to avoid crosscontamination.
- At lunchtime, discard all used food packaging and paper bags. Do not reuse packaging because it could contaminate other food and cause foodborne illness.

Chill: Keep Lunches Cold

- Keeping food cold slows bacterial growth and keeps food safe.
- Harmful bacteria multiply rapidly in the "Danger Zone" — the temperatures between 40 and 140 °F.
 Keep perishable food refrigerated
- until time to leave home. Include a frozen gel pack or frozen
- juice box with perishable food in the insulated lunch bag or lunch box.
- Use an insulated soft-sided bag if possible. It's best for keeping food cold.
- Store perishable items in a refrigerator (if available) immediately upon arrival.

Keep Hot Lunches Hot

- Use an insulated container to keep hot food hot 140 °F or above.
- Cook frozen convenience meals according to package instructions, including standing time if using a microwave.

Food Safety ALERT!

Perishable food transported without an ice source will stay safe only <u>2 hours</u> (1 hour if the temperature is above 90 °F).
