IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA AT LINCOLN!!! UNL will no longer accept ACT or SAT scores sent from high schools starting with students entering in the summer or fall of 2011. These test scores MUST be sent to UNL DIRECTLY from the testing agency! Any student interested in attending UNL should make sure they choose UNL's code when registering for these tests. The scores will be sent to UNL for free. If any parent or student has any questions about this policy, please ask Mrs. Luther.

SENIORS: Have you checked out Overton's website? Click on the "College Information" link.

JUNIORS—it's never too early to look at this yourself! Another site available is SchoolSoup.com. It is supposed to be the largest scholarship database in the world. We have added this link to our website, as well.

SENIORS: If you think you might do your FAFSA online, you need to register for a PIN.

Dependent students must have their parents register. This may be done at www.pin.ed.gov. FAFSA is the form that allows you to receive college grants and loans from the government. You will not fill out the form until after the first of the year, but you can apply for your PIN anytime.

POTENTIAL COLLEGE ATHLETES: register with the NCAA clearinghouse! Come see me if you have any questions. ACT scores must be sent to the clearinghouse via ACT, not our school.

PLEASE NOTE!!! The NCAA is changing eligibility rules beginning with this year's senior and freshmen classes. Division II schools have increased the number of core classes from 14 to 16, a rule that starts with this year's senior class. Division I has increased its minimum core class GPA from 2.0 to 2.3. They will also require that 10 of the 16 core course requirements be finished before the beginning of the student's 7th semester, or at the beginning of their senior year. This will impact this year's freshmen students.

The NAIA has started a registration process for potential athletes, much like the NCAA. If you have a student interested in playing for one of these colleges, check out their website at www.playnaia.org.

The next ACT TESTING DATE is February 9th. Registration for that test has ended. THIS TEST WILL NOT BE GIVEN IN OVERTON!!!! ACT tests will be given in Overton this year in April and June. The registration deadline for the April 13th test is March 8th. Students who qualify for free or reduced lunch prices may be able to receive a fee waiver from ACT. Remember you now MUST upload a picture to your application!!! See Mrs. Luther for more information.

ACT reports that 70% of all test-takers now register online. They are encouraging as many students as possible to sign up in this manner. Information is in Mrs. Luther's office; or you may go to act.org for details or to set up a free account.

The UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA AT LINCOLN'S COLLEGE OF ARCHITECTURE will again sponsor summer workshop for high school students in 10th-12th grades. The workshop will be on the UNL campus from June 9th to June 15th. Students interested in Architecture, Interior Design, or Landscape Architecture are encouraged to apply before April 5th. - * Students wishing to apply to the UNK HONORS PROGRAM must have all application materials (for both UNK and the separate Honors Program app.) submitted by February 1st. Students must have a minimum ACT score of 27 and rank in the top 25% of their class to apply. There is often book scholarships available with this program.
- * The HIGH PLAINS CHAPTER OF THE AMERICAN METEOROLOGICAL SOCIETY AND NATIONAL WEATHER ASSOCIATION will again award their JIM JOHNSON SCHOLARSHIP. The award is valued at \$500 for a senior planning to major in a physical science area. Applications are in Mrs. Luther's office and are due April 1st.
- * The BUICK ACHIEVERS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM will award over 1000 scholarships with values from \$2000 to \$25,000 for high school seniors AND undergraduates who is planning to major in engineering and technology who have interest in working in the automotive industry. Applications are at www.buickachievers.com and are due Feb. 28th.

- * The SUSAN THOMPSON BUFET FOUNDATION will begin accepting applications for their scholarships on January 1st. It is best to start planning for this application NOW!!! This very generous scholarship (last year estimated at being worth over \$55,000) must be completed by March 1st (although some documents may be uploaded to the application site through March 15th). The scholarship may be used at any of the University of Nebraska campuses or at any state or community college campus. Applicants must have at least an 80% overall high school GPA and be a graduating senior from a Nebraska high school. FAFSA applications MUST be completed and returned to complete this scholarship application. Please start planning early, as this requires tax information to be complete!!! Families with a combined income of up to \$95,000 may satisfy the financial need criterion. Please consider applying for this scholarship!!!! See Mrs. Luther for further details!!!! Information and the application may be found at www.buffettscholarships.org.
- * COLLEGEBOUND NEBRASKA is a scholarship program available through the University and State College systems in Nebraska. If a student is eligible for a Pell Grant through the FAFSA process, they may be able to receive a full tuition grant. Students and parents must complete the FAFSA process by April 1st to be eligible. See Mrs. Luther with any questions!!
- * The NEBRASKA PRESS ASSOCIATION FOUNDATION will award two \$2,000 scholarships to seniors planning to pursue a journalism career at a Nebraska university or college. The deadline for the application is February 22nd. Mrs. Luther has applications, but they can also be found online at www.nebpress.com.
- * The Central Platte Natural Resources District is again offering 10 \$1000 scholarships for students planning to major in a variety of agricultural or environmental careers. The application may be found at www.cpnrd.org or in Mrs. Luther's office. The deadline is March 15th.
