## What is Continuous Improvement?



As stated from the NDE (<u>Nebraska</u> <u>Department of Education</u>),

"A school improvement process is a systematic on-going process involving planning, implementation, and evaluation and renewal of school improvement activities to meet local and statewide goals and priorities. <u>All</u> accredited schools in Nebraska **must** have a school improvement process in effect according to Rule 10-009.01.

The process includes **a periodic review** by visiting educators who **provide consultation** to the local school/community in continued accomplishment of **plans and a goals**. In accordance with Rule 10-009.01B each school must have an **external team visit at least once each five years**."

Unmanned aerial systems have entered the Overton Public Schools. Many of you have seen the football games being filmed from a new angle. This is just a part of the adventure of the Aerial platform. Seventh grade student have begun flying the aircraft as a part of the computer exploratory.



They have learned communication and teamwork. The coordination of flying four drones in close proximity requires both attention of the individual and communication with others. The students have gained confidence in flying and maneuvering around the parking lot. They photograph and perform video recording during the flights. One student has also assisted with collecting the football game videos.

Seventh grade has then applied the art of video editing. By combining footage from drone flights and the experience of flying, students move towards an exploration of creating a new segment. They are using Adobe Premier Rush to create short video including text and transitional pieces. Some may continue their video career into television or movie making. We may be starting the next major blockbuster with an exposure to the process in 7<sup>th</sup> grade.






### **Middle School Social Science**

The school year is once again upon us and off to a fast start. The middle school social science classes have dived right in to learning about the past. 8<sup>th</sup> graders have spent the first few weeks of school learning about the struggle our nation went through to stay whole. They jumped right into the civil war era and learned about the struggle our country faced. The 7<sup>th</sup> grade has been learning about what was happening in what becomes the United States before it was a country. They looked at Native Americans and then European exploration. They are just starting to look at colonization that will lead up to our war for independence. The 6<sup>th</sup> grade is focusing on early world history and how societies developed over thousands of years. They will be focusing on early empires that emerged around the world. ## What is Early Intervention?

The term "early intervention" is important because research shows that the first three years are the most important time for learning in a child's life. Providing developmental supports and services early improves a child's ability to develop and learn. Also, it may prevent or decrease the need for special help later. The goal of early intervention in Nebraska is to "open a window of opportunity" for families to help their children with special needs develop to their full potential.

The Early Development Network-Babies Can't Wait can help you and your family support and promote your child's development, within your family activities and community life. Nebraska's Early Development Network supports children birth through three years of age who have special developmental needs. The Nebraska Early Development Network program "connects" families with early intervention services, such as occupational, speech or physical therapy, to help infants and toddlers grow and develop and help their families in this process. It is a voluntary program and does not discriminate based on race, culture, religion, income level, or disability.

Supports may include, but is not limited to:

Services Coordination Early Childhood Special Education Parent to parent support Respite Care Transportation Speech/Language Therapy Physical Therapy Occupational Therapy Psychological Services Vision Services Audiology Assistive technology devices and services

Other services may be provided based on the needs and eligibility of the child and family.

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
