The Overton FCCLA Chapter attended the Nebraska FCCLA State Leadership Conference on April 8th-10th in Lincoln. While at the conference members had the chance to hear from keynote speaker Ryan Moran, who spoke to students about finding their gifts and talents, not fearing the unknown, and about the big difference even one student can make. Chapter members also had the opportunity to attend breakout sessions about healthy relationships, stress management, how to use social media for positive change, developing leadership strengths, Taking Down Tobacco, Nebraska Peer Education and more.

On Monday, 12 students competed in the Nebraska State STAR competition. Earning Top Gold State Champion and qualifying for Nationals were Calli Weston in Interpersonal Communications, Jr. and Abby Lawton in Chapter Service Project Display, Jr. Receiving Runner-Up and also qualifying for nationals was Sidney Enochs and Jaycee Wallace in Chapter Service Portfolio, Sr. Earning State Runner-Up in the Nebraska Consumer Issues, Jr. category was Stephanie Magnuson. Receiving gold medals were Jordan Bidwell in Illustrated Talk, Sr. and Hannah Smith in Recycle and Redesign, Jr. Silver medal winners were Darcy Stewart in National Programs in Action, Sr., Megan Zulkoski in Nebraska Health and Wellness, Sr., Rebecca Zeleski in Illustrated Talk, Jr., Jada Araujo and Alexzandria Rodriguez in Nebraska Family Challenges and Issues, Jr.

Five students from Overton were recognized for completing all five units of the Power of One program including Jordan Bidwell, Sarah Cox, Dilan Smith, Rebecca Zeleski and Samantha Sarratt. Diana Perdomo served as an Honorary Conference Assistant, helping with various behind the scenes duties throughout the conference. President-elect Lilly Nelms also attended District Officer training and planning for the 2018-2019 school year.

During the Business and Recognition Session, Jordan Bidwell was selected to be one of four finalists recognized on stage for the Ultimate Leader Award. The winner was announced that night and Jordan was selected as the first ever Nebraska FCCLA Ultimate Leader award recipient. Also during this session the Overton Chapter was awarded a Gold Star Chapter Award as well as 3rd place in the Chapter Developer Contest. Overton FCCLA was also recognized for projects completed in the National Programs STOP the Violence and Student and for participating in the Nebraska CTSO service project Feed Nebraska. Mrs. Ehlers received an ACE- Adviser Committed to Excellence award as well as being recognized for her 10th year as an adviser. Overall, the Overton FCCLA Chapter had a very successful State Leadership Conference.
